Matt Gatens, Iowa junior:

"It's disappointing. There are so many resources around the campus they gave us to help us out in that area. Brennan, he got off to a rough start obviously with his grades and didn't recover in time. I think it's just an opportunity for him to learn and hopefully grow and not let it happen again. He'll bounce back from it. He's a good kid, and we'll miss him. He's a good kid, a good player, and he's a good friend. He's a good guy. It's just bad to see it happen to a good guy like him. I think Brennan knows it's no one else's but his fault that he let it happen. Hopefully, he'll go to JUCO for a year or how long it takes and bounce back and have a successful career."

Darryl Moore, former Iowa player:
