Brendan's Three Keys to the Game:

1. Third-down conversions

If the Hawkeyes want to dominate this game from start to finish, then this is an area that needs to be strong. Ball State struggled against Purdue last week defensively in this department early on, and it paid off in the end for the Boilermakers. If Iowa keeps the chains moving and converts on third downs, this should be as easy a victory as the Hawkeyes
